

# R.E. Knowledge Organiser - What Would Jesus Do?

## Key Vocabulary

<b>beatitudes</b>	Eight <b> blessings </b> recounted by Jesus at the Sermon on the Mount. From the Latin 'beatus' meaning blessed.
<b>foundation</b>	The load-bearing base (e.g. of a building). An underlying basis or principle.
<b>gospel</b>	The teaching of Jesus Christ (in the first four books of the New Testament: Matthew, Mark, Luke, John) Translation is ' <b>good news</b> '
<b>moral</b>	Relating to what is right or wrong behaviour.
<b>parable</b>	A story used to illustrate a spiritual or moral lesson e.g. The Good Samaritan, The Sower, The Prodigal Son.
<b>sermon</b>	A talk by a religious leader on a religious or moral subject.
<b>The Sermon on the Mount.</b>	The greatest sermon Jesus preached. It is named because Jesus delivered it to his disciples at the top of a mountain. It contains the beatitudes and the Lord's Prayer and is recounted in the Gospels of

### The Lord's Prayer

9 "This, then, is how you should pray:

10 "Our Father in heaven,

hallowed be your name,

11 your kingdom come,

your will be done,

on earth as it is in heaven.

12 Give us today our daily bread.

13 And forgive us our debts,

as we also have forgiven our debtors.

14 And lead us not into temptation,<sup>(a)</sup>

but deliver us from the evil one.<sup>(b)</sup>
