INDUSTRIAL STRIKE ACTION

As you will be aware, the National Education Union (NEU), National Association of Head Teachers (NAHT) and National Association of Schoolmasters Union of Women Teachers (NASUWT) held ballots of their members on industrial action. Following these votes, members of the NEU across England have decided to strike.

The NAHT and the NASUWT strikes will not be proceeding as not enough members voted.

In this region, strikes will take place across Wednesday 15th March and Thursday 16th March. These may have an impact on our Federation of schools.

As a result of the strike on Wednesday 15th March and Thursday 16th March 2023:

Infant School will remain open as normal on both Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th March 2023.

Junior School will remain open on Wednesday 15th March as normal, but on Thursday 16th March the Year 3 and Year 6 classes will be closed to all pupils except those who are considered vulnerable or pupils from key worker families. The Year 4 and Year 5 classes will remain open as normal on this second day of strike action.

When classes are closed, pupils should remain at home and will be provided with a programme of home/remote learning. We understand that many parents and carers may have other pressures on this day, so we aim to make home learning activities as simple as possible for pupils to complete independently. Below is a list of suggested ideas. If there is anything more specific to be completed, these will be sent via Class Dojo.

Closed classes will remain open for vulnerable children and for children of key workers, whom we have on record, prioritising those children whose parents work for the NHS and emergency services. The school office will contact you via text message/email as early as possible to inform you that your child is eligible to come to school on Thursday 16th March, as they fall into this category. Should numbers of children become greater than those we have on record, it may be unsafe to open with the shortage of staffing and as a result, the school may need to close to all pupils affected regardless of the key worker/vulnerability criteria.

Children eligible for a free school meal, who are not in school will be provided with a school packed lunch, which will need to be collected on the strike day from us. If you do not require this lunch, please let the school office know to save on food wastage. If we do not hear from you, the school will contact you to confirm.

Please be aware that this is the current picture; should there be any last minute changes we will strive to give you as much notice as possible using our text message and email service.
